





"They were dealing with that problem for over a year," Timothy told Insider. He left this summer, citing the rat issue as well as management's treatment of employees. At the time he quit, Timothy was working at several different stores as part of a team in charge of cleaning up stores before annual inventory checks and visits by company higher-ups.

The plea agreement said that in August 2020, the company first received reports of "mouse and pest issues," although deliveries continued to 404 stores in Alabama, Missouri, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas and Tennessee. The company admitted that some employees were aware in January 2021 that the conditions at the warehouse were illegal.





A popular soup has been recalled thanks to bugs hiding in its ingredients, according to the Food and Drug Administration.

The product manufacturer, initiated the recall on July 10 for Broccoli Cheddar Soup "because the product has insects in the frozen broccoli florets," according to the FDA report.

The notice applies to 20-ounce packages sold in Florida, Illinois, California, Texas, Washington, Pennsylvania and Connecticut. Soup packages with use by dates between 07/18/23 and 09/15/23 should be thrown away or returned for a full refund, according to a announcement on Thursday.

The FDA determined the recall as "class III," meaning "a situation in which use of or exposure to a violative product is not likely to cause adverse health consequences." There are currently 10,889 affected cases, according to the report.

The premises were inspected in September 2022 following complaints received by

Environmental Health

Officers found evidence which included a dead mouse, mouse droppings and urine, gnawed food packaging and containers, pest nesting materials and contaminated food ingredients.

The court heard adequate procedures were not in place to manage the risks of contamination of food ingredients by pests and the premises were found to be visibly dirty with poor standards of cleaning observed throughout.

The business' failure to implement and maintain adequate pest control procedures resulted in a severe infestation, requiring to immediately close the business due to the imminent and serious risk to health.

The team exercised their powers under emergency legislation to prohibit its business operations and seized a quantity of food which was condemned by the court and destroyed.
